



Context of participation within services

Participation forms the fundamental component of the plan-do-review cycle. This cycle is the key process for ensuring quality performance at all levels of the support structure.

Information gleaned about the quality of service and its impact on an individual child or young person should be fed from individual review process and self-evaluation processes in to service review.

This information will influence policy and practice within any individual service it will also provide important intelligence which can be fed upwards in to the local strategic planning processes.

The accumulated intelligence from a range of services within the locality will be taken in to the strategic plan-do-review process and in turn may inform either changes in policy or practice which will be fed back to service providers and in turn have effect on individual service users.

Where national policy fora are seeking information from locality strategic groups the evidence used to create such submissions must be derived from the experience of the service users as gathered within the area plan-do-review process.

In diagrammatic form this structure can be seen as five plan-do-review loops operating in parallel but joined by information up and feedback down interfaces. There may be times the feed in and feedback information interfaces with other services or strategies.
